D.R.A.W. - Draw and Reflect Art Workshop

This free on-site workshop engages students with The Drawing Center's exhibitions through a guided tour and hands-on project. Specific works will be discussed in detail in order to practice sustained observation and encourage more personal and thoughtful responses. The art-making project will take place in the galleries as well, continuing the students' immersion with the work and enabling experimentation with visual concepts.

D.R.A.W tours last 1.5 hours and are free to New York City public and private schools, as well as home school, after-school, and camp programs. The museum can accommodate class sizes of 30 or less. Groups may book guided tours on Monday and Tuesdays from 10AM – 6PM, Wednesday 10AM – 12PM, and Thursday and Friday by special request.

Classes are encouraged to visit more than once over the course of a year to experience first-hand a variety of exhibitions.
